KOOKABURRA WHO GOD IS

Dear Friends,

When we read the news, we are often confronted with the world's troubles. The uncertainty, chaos and changes can be overwhelming, especially when starting your day with headlines that make it seem like everything is collapsing. We can often feel threatened, pushed and crushed on every side, both physically and spiritually. It's not just the physical challenges like fires, storms, politics and wars. It is also spiritually, we face the rejection of God, questioning of our faith and erosion of our beliefs in culture as Jesus' followers. This constant pressure can be overwhelming, affecting everything we accept, believe, trust, and adhere to in our lives.

Recently, I've been reflecting on the first 8 verses from the prophet Nahum in the Old Testament. This is an amazing prophecy that applies to all of us. We don't often fully consider who God is - the wonderful, powerful and almighty God we serve, who knows each of us. Phil Wickham sings a great song called "The Battle Belongs to You." The lyrics to the chorus are:

> "So when I fight, I'll fight on my knees With my hands lifted high Oh God, the battle belongs to You And every fear I lay at Your feet *I'll sing through the night* Oh God, the battle belongs to You"

And I wonder, is this what we do in practice? Do we hand it over to God and say, "The battle belongs to You"? Or do we hold onto it ourselves and struggle through, forgetting that He is God? Do we feel overwhelmed by the battle and say, "Where are You, God? I don't know where You are"? These lyrics remind us that the battle does indeed belong to God. We can and must trust Him with it!

Nahum 1:1-8 is a great reminder to us that the battle belongs to God. I encourage you to take a moment to read those verses now. What is your reaction after reading this passage?

This prophecy comes at a time when Israel is enduring the long and painful oppression of the Assyrians. They are living under this pressure, yet God is using them as His instrument during this time and purging these people. There are three verses that I want to highlight to you.

The first verse I would like us to reflect on is verse 3: "The Lord is slow to get angry, but His power is great, and He never lets the guilty go unpunished." It almost seems like a contradiction, but it's a perfect balance. One author said: "It's a restraint born of meekness, not of weakness. Not to be misunderstood as passivity." I thought that was a great way of saying it. We shouldn't just think, 'Oh, God just sits here and lets everything happen.' He is slow to anger, but that doesn't oppose the fact that His power is great. And we shouldn't think it is not because He is slow to get angry; God is engaged in this world. Sometimes we can think, 'Where is God? He isn't doing anything.' But the warning is not to lose sight of His greatness because of His patience with us. So, I think that is a wonderful verse, particularly after it talks about Him being a vengeful God "filled with vengeance and rage." He is, but He is slow to get angry, slow to exercise those things.

I love verse 7 too, and the first part of this verse says: "The Lord is good, a strong refuge when trouble comes." If you have read the verses that come before, what a great thing it is to have the One who causes those things, to be the One who is the refuge. Another person I was reading said: "When you read those verses that say: 'In His presence the mountains quake and the hills melt away, who can stand before Him?' These are the results of God simply passing by; they can't even stand in His presence." This is the result of Him exercising His greatness in the world. But God's goodness is foundational to who He is and the faith we have in Him. And God defends His people by being their refuge. What a refuge we have! So, we can trust Him, can't we? Because He is the refuge when troubles come.





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Finally, in verses 7b – 8a it says: "He is close to those who trust in Him. But he will sweep away His enemies in an overwhelming flood." This provides a great comparison to those who trust Him and those who don't. He is the refuge who protects those who trust Him, but at the same time, He can sweep away His enemies in a flood. Verse 8 ends by saying: "He will pursue His foes into the *darkness of night.*" We can trust Him, and we need to trust Him. When we think about what we do in this world with SIM, we want people to come to know Jesus and trust Him. Trust this God, trust this faith and know this God. It's an encouragement not to be fearful about what is happening in this world but to have complete faith that we have a refuge. A wonderful quote I read recently said, "Goodness in God does not obviate His judgement." We can trust that our God is good and just. I think sometimes we can emphasise the good part of His character and overlook the judgement, but we need to hold the two in balance, just like this passage.

So, my encouragement to all of you is to remember who God is for us today. What a heavenly Father to know, serve and trust. The One who is good, the One who is a judge, the One who is slow to get angry and the One whose power is great. The battle belongs to God and we have assurance in who He is. There is a faith and trust relationship that must exist with Him. He is close to those who trust Him. That means trusting Him in the storms and difficult times because He is close. He is our refuge, protector and rock. So, despite the world events we read about in the news or the storms we may be navigating personally, we can trust Him because He is more powerful than anything else. He really does have the whole world in His hands!


